

When you see the world through the eyes of a vulnerable child it can be painful, frightening and lonely.

One billion children worldwide live in poverty, with

- 6.6 million under-five year-olds dying from preventable causes
- 15% of children engaged in work
- One in ten girls married before their 15th birthday
- 57 million primary-aged children out of school

In addition, child poverty has increased in **23 developed world countries** since 2008.

And yet we believe that God brings **protection**, **provision** and **promises**. Our plea on behalf of children at risk is that God would give them strength, carry them through their desperately tough times, and ultimately change their situations for the better.

The 2015 World Weekend of Prayer campaign is focused on the words of Jesus in Matthew's gospel: "I am with you always".

We know that during the weekend thousands of children across the world will turn to God in prayer – thanking him for his goodness and faithfulness, and asking for change in their situations.

Please join them, and pray that children, whether close to your home or further away, will know that God is with them always.

Pray too that we, as parents, caregivers and role models, would act in a Christ-like way, **keeping the children** around us safe and well, and helping them to fulfil their God-given potential.

God protects

The power of children's prayer

Through times of fear and insecurity, and in a country where widespread poverty makes life tough, a Christian programme in **Cambodia** sees huge value in teaching children, and those who work with children, about the power of prayer.

The **Children's Prayer Movement programme** has developed a year-long prayer teaching curriculum, and aims to make pastors and children's workers more aware of child spirituality. It is changing the landscape of the Church in relation to children.

Programme director Pang Sophany says, "We believe that children's prayer is one of the most powerful weapons to bring change to their families, communities and the nation."

Twelve year-old **Bun Ngong Kim** is cared for by his grandmother because his parents are divorced. Although life isn't easy for him, and his education is uncertain, his faith is simple and unshaken.

He says, "I always pray for God to help me to go to school regularly. May God bring my parents back together so that I can live with them as a family. By God's grace, everything in my life will be taken care of by faith."
